Throughout Camden County there are countless stories about its evolution and growth as shown through over 20 historic sites, including Revolutionary War era taverns, restored railroad stations, magnificent Federal mansions, the largest and most highly decorated battleship, simple arm houses and row homes, an early log cabin, a school house, a general store, a soaring cathedral, and an early novie theater. All illustrate Camden County's proud history over three centuries through their artifacts. archives, and exhibits.

Begin your Heritage Trail here!

organized the 48 Camden County History Alliance historic sites and history organizations into a series of seven Heritage Trails for the Camden County Heritage Trails Map and Guide. Each of the seven Heritage Trails highlights events and lives relating to its theme, represented by a unique color and symbol on the map. Most sites appear in more than one theme, because history is not static. These sites have seen war, peace, economic uncertainty, and robust growth over one or more centuries, and have stories to tell throughout their evolution. All of our Heritage Trails include the Camden County Historical Society (CCHS) in Camden NJ, which has an incomparable collection of artifacts, extensive research archives, and features informative permanent and changing exhibitions on Camden County history.

How to use the Camden County Heritage Trails Map and Guide

Some Heritage Trail users may attempt to visit as many sites as possible in an afternoon, while others may opt for a small number, often those close to home. Either way, use are widely separated, while other sites are located close ogether; use your judgement about going from place to place as there is no preferred order. Just have fun!

Call ahead!

When planning your day out, make sure to contact all of the sites and organizations in advance to make sure they are open when you wish to visit. Since most of the sites are operated by volunteers, it is wise to call ahead, or theck the site's website to get the latest open hour

About the Camden County Heritage Trails ns from 1677 into the 20th Camuen County's diverse history spans from 1677 into the 20th Century, and includes famous people, magnificent architecture, African American heritage, women's lives, and how our rivers,

oads and railways transformed the county.

Built in Camden County structures. You can visit the mighty Battleship New Jersey, the Historic Berlin Train Depot built in 1856, and the Colonial-era Gabreil Daveis Tavern and Indian King Tavern. Other restored Colonial or Federal homes include the 1693 Griffith Morgan House, Pomona Hall at the Camden County Historical Society, Borrough-Dover House, Collings-Knight House, Barclay Farmstead, and Greenfield Hall at the Historical Society of Haddonfield. The Peter Mott House is a wooden farm house, while the Walt Whitman House is a simple 19th Century Maritime Museum, Newton Friends Meetinghouse, 1821 Champion School, 1927 Ritz Theatre, Scottish Rite Auditorium.

recent past. Visit the Battleship New Jersey and the Camden Shipyard & Maritime Museum to explore the shipbuilding industry. Heroic stories of Holocaust urvivors and concentration camp liberators are told at Esther survivors and concentration camp liberators are told at Esther Raab Holocaust Museum & Goodwin Education Center, while the Peter Mott House honors soldiers and nurses of World War I. Life at home during the 20th century is interpreted at the Clementon Historical Museum, Winslow Township History Center, Griffith Morgan House, Gabriel Daveis Tavern, and Gloucester City Historical Society. Visit the Stratford Quaker Store, and learn about school life at the Champion School. 20th Century social changes are discussed at the Camden County Historical Society, along with exhibits on Victor Talking Machine Company. The early entertainment industry is also highlighted at The Vault of Victor Records, Ritz Theatre, and Scottish Rite Auditorium. Nine history organizations also interpret the 20th century through their programming or exhibits.

African American Heritage umden County, and these historic sites

interpret some aspect of the lives of African Americans. The Peter Mott House is a documented station on the Underground Railroad, and is located in the early free Black community Snow Hill. The Camden in the early free black community show thit. The Cambell County Historical Society maintains an African American History Room with changing exhibits celebrating local African Americans through the centuries, while also acknowledging Pomona Halls history as a slave plantation. The Burrough-Dover House and Griffith Morgan House also discuss the enslawed persons who lived at these sites during the colonial era. During the anti-slavery movement in Camden County, famous abolition ist Sojourner Truth visited the Newton Friends Meetinghouse ist sojourner Trutin visted the sewton Friends meetingnouse. The Old Baldy Clivil War Round Table provides programming about the fight against slavery. Six other history organizations also highlight Camden County's African American heritage.

Women in History

Nomen have significantly contributed to Camden County history through their roles as early pioneers, business people, household managers, activists, and heroines. The Historical Society of Haddonfield celebrates Elizabeth Haddon Estaugh, founder of Haddonfield. Daily activities of early American omen are demonstrated at Barclay Farmstead, Collings-Knight ouse, Griffith Morgan House, and the Gabreil Daveis Tavern, which was once operated by a woman. The Newton Friends Meetinghouse was visited by women's rights activists Lucretia Mott and Sojourner Truth, while the Peter Mott House celebrate traveling preacher Jarena Lee. Learn about the role of women shipbuilders on the Battleship New Jersey, and hear stories of roines and survivors at the Esther Raab Holocaust Museum & Goodwin Education Center. The Camden County Historical ociety's holdings include women's handiwork, writings, and

Rivers, Roads & Rails

Camden's waterfront, explore camden's shipbuilding heritage at the Camden Shipyard and Maritime Museum, and learn about life along the riverfront at the Gloucester City Historical Society, Other historic sites along once navigable rivers include the Griffith Morgan House, Collings-Knight House, Gabreil Daveis Tavern, and Glover Fulling Mill Park. The Camden County Historical Society's museum features ferryboats and New York Ship Building Compa-ny, along with archives about roads and railroads. The Historic Berlin Train Depot, built in 1856, is the oldest railroad station in New Jersey, while the Magnolia Train Station was carefully rebuilt. Learn about Haddonfield as a railroad stop at the Historical Society of Haddonfield. The West Jersey Chapter of National Railway Historical Society also celebrates the railroads that crisscrossed the
